




Ride 2 School update

For our most recent Walking Wheeling Wednesday, our Hands Up Count results were:

30 people rode

It has come to our attention that many students do not have their helmets fitted correctly. Please refer to the information provided to ensure you are being safe when riding to school.

The Ride28ohool Program encourages the use of helmets when children are riding bikes or scooters. We've developed this guide to ensure your childs helmet is the correct size and fit.

Step One: With loose straps, ensure that the helmet sits centered on the hear





Step Two: Adjust the chin straps — It should sit tightly but not uncomfortable





Step Three: Ensure the helmet sits correctly on the head by measuring out a two finger spacing from the top of the





Step Four: If possible, adjust the connection point of the neck strap so that it sits on the jaw, just below the ear.





Step Five: Tighten the neck strap so that both sides are tight and both connection points remain on the Jaw between the ears. The straps should not twist or cover the ears. When done up correctly the straps should provide a snug fit





Step Six: Ensure that the helmet does not move off the forehead or from side to side







Music/Performing Arts

Music is buzzing along at Benton Junior College with all year levels completing projects and self-assessment rubrics to go with them. An excellent feature of our program is that the children are taught to read formal music notation from Year 1. To some this may seem old fashioned perhaps even a little boring but to the children think it is anything but.

They begin by practicing to draw the treble clef (symbol to begin playing) on proper staff (music) lines. From there they draw the correct notes on the staff. There are several notes to remember but this is achieved by using a mnemonic system. The notes on the line (E G B D F) are remembered by saying "every good boy deserves fruit" or "every burger deserves fries" while the notes in the spaces (F A C E) are remembered by saying "face in the space". It is a lot of fun and the children find it a very effective way to remember all the notes.




We researched animals and what they need to GROW and SURVIVE.
